I currently serve as lecturer in African and African American Studies at Arizona State University in the School of Social Transformation. I hold a bachelor's degree from SUNY Buffalo State College '09, a master's degree from Columbia University, and an MFA degree from Moore College of Art and Design.

My work combines curatorial practice, studio art, and pedagogical practice and historicizes concepts of embodied and metaphysical ancestor in Black culture around the Americas. Combining practices of archival research, writing, documentary photography, and printmaking, I attend to the ways Black artists mobilized various visual media to create strategic ancestral linkages in their contentious efforts at reshaping social, political, and geographic terrains throughout the Americas.

In 2020, I presented my research and scholarship on the "Votes for Women: American Women Artists and Strategies for Inclusion" plenary panel for the Association of Historians of American Art at the 108th College Art Association Conference and was invited by the African American Museum in Philadelphia as a guest curator to further research, interpret and exhibit the works of Anna Russell Jones which culminated in the 2021 exhibition, *Anna Russell Jones: The Art of Design*.

What are some memories or experiences from your time at Buffalo State?

My most memorable moments are connected from time spent in and passing through the Student Union. No matter if residential, commuter, international or etc. it was truly a warm place on campus where things were happening, people were out and about (in and out from the cold), grabbing meals, talking, scheduling events, planning, or sharing ideas, holding programs, playing music, dancing, mixing, laughing, acting, stunting, doing it all and on, and on, and on. It was something to remember. Things ebbed out from there across campus and Buffalo, even throughout NYS and important things too. It made our campus and college its own in many particular and infinite ways. The way the campus lit up, flickered, got light, and notably fastidious during those moments and years are truly unforgettable. They were not by chance. Those moments came together and were made up by the relations, connections, conversations, and showing-up-andshowing-out that is, that indelibly is, Buffalo State—on and at its very best.

What were your favorite things to do or places to go in Buffalo?

Truly, I enjoyed walking up and down Elmwood. Starting from the gates of the College and walking down past the myriad of architectures, checking out all the good food, stepping into all the random small or independently run shops and restaurant that flow into Allentown. I spent probably way too many "quiet" moments between the Burchfield-Penney (back when it was still in Rockwell Hall) and the Albright-Knox along with meandering around to find coffee shops and bookstores. That was my thing, I guess. But my favorite thing was to "chill" and just hang-out with different people. Getting on the bus, figuring out who's-riding-withwho, and just checking out everything that was in the city and region. I was fortunate enough to enjoy some very, very spicy wings at the wing fest downtown; randomly ride the elevators to the top of some the historic buildings to overlook the city's "spokes" as I was learning about it; eat some amazing soul food at Gi Gi's on the eastside of Buffalo with Dr. Felix L. Armfield (who also introduce me to the wonderment of history and scholarship that is both the Michigan Avenue/Street Baptist Church and Nash House); Juneteenth at MLK; breakfast, brunch, and dinner at Pano's, of course; road-trips to Clifton Hill and Toronto to pick up authentic handsewn Carnival costumes for a student-led event; riding down along the lake to see Graycliff and wandering around the Darwin D.Martin House; walks in Delaware Park (both sides); snowboarding in the mountains a short drive away; trekking around Squaw [now Unity] Island; eating some amazing Puerto Rican food on the westside; checking out decks and trucks at the skate shop on Elmwood, especially with my younger brother; planning programs, and prepping and cooking food for events on campus and in Buffalo, especially with my older brother.

What advice would you give to current Honors students at Buffalo State?

Within reason, love and trust yourself. Think often with genuine curiosity. Study and work with sincerity. Learn much and share much. Time and moments hold much unexpected wonderment and unanticipated realizations. Even if patiently, believe in yourself.


