

Faculty Spotlight



CAROLYN GUZSKI

Carolyn Guzski joined the Buffalo State faculty in 2009 as an assistant professor of musicology. Her research interests include American music, opera, and national cultural institutions during the Progressive Era. She has presented papers at the annual meetings of the American Musicological Society and the Society for American Music. She received her Ph.D. in musicology from the Graduate Center of the City University of New York, where her dissertation on American opera at the Metropolitan was a winner of the Barry Brook Award, and holds degrees in performance from the Peabody Institute of the Johns Hopkins University and the Juilliard School. She previously taught at Hunter College, New York University, and the Aaron Copland School of Music at Queens College.

As a pianist, Guzski has performed throughout the U.S. and has been heard in New York at Alice Tully Hall, Weill Recital Hall, Merkin Concert Hall, and the Juilliard Theater. Past seasons have included concerts in Japan, Italy, Switzerland, South Korea, and the Caribbean, as well as broadcasts over RAI television (Italy), WFMT (Chicago), WNCN (New York), and the Voice of America network. As an opera coach, she has participated in seasons of the Florida Grand Opera, the Lake George Opera Festival, the Aspen Music Festival, and the Orvieto Musica festival in the Umbria region of Italy, and has served on the musical staffs of Montclair State College, Hofstra University, and the Mannes College of Music.

Professor Guzski recently led an Honors-sponsored trip with her MUS201 class to see the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra at Kleinhans Music Hall. She has also brought past Honors groups to the Darwin Martin house and other Buffalo attractions.



KEN OROSZ

My Dad was a US diplomat, so I largely grew up in Belgium and England as an embassy brat. For me, going to college in the US was essentially a 4 year study abroad experience which I extended another 30-plus years and counting by staying on for grad school and then pursuing a teaching career. I've also had a lot of side jobs along the way, including factory work packaging picnic cutlery, phone service operator, bank teller, and international tour guide.

Given my childhood - which included stints in international schools with peers from around the world - it was inevitable that I would end up studying history. I came to Buffalo State in 2008 after holding faculty positions at Mansfield University (1997-1999) and University of Maine at Farmington (1999-2008). Over the years I have been involved in the Fulbright program as both an advisor and grant recipient (Germany 1995-1996), the Africana Studies program here at Buffalo State, am a past president of the French Colonial Historical Society (2012-2014), and just finished a 4 year stint as editor of the bilingual journal French Colonial History.

While I teach courses on the Holocaust (coming Fall 2022), modern Europe, imperialism, and African history, my particular area of expertise is French and German colonial rule in Cameroon. My published work generally falls into the realm of social and cultural history, ranging from missionary run schools to Sultan Njoya's invention of the Bamum alphabet, WW I propaganda in Africa, and the inspiration behind C. S. Forester's novel African Queen. Current projects include Eugène Jamot's work on battling trypanosomiasis (sleeping sickness) and how tourism and big game hunting in the 1920s led to the creation of Cameroon's first game preserves.

Outside of the classroom and archives I enjoy travel, hiking, and camping. I have been known to dabble in woodworking and during the pandemic I also learned to scuba dive and brew beer.





Final Thoughts: You can pursue and achieve anything you want. If you pursue want you want, you can achieve everything you can imagine


